Financial Counseling Available

The sun is finally coming out, bringing us blooming plants and trees. With this comes allergy symptoms for many of us such as runny nose, watery eyes and/or sneezing. High pollen concentrations are during the hours of 5am and 10am. Try to avoid being outdoors during these hours. Days that are dry and windy, or periods of the day following a rain are times when the pollen count is the highest. Take extra precautions during these times. When driving, keep the car windows rolled up; use the air conditioner on maximum air settings with recirculation to decrease your exposure to pollens. Other key reminders are to increase fluid intake, contact your doctor for any changes in color of nasal drainage, and consult your doctor or pharmacist prior to using any over the counter allergy relief medication if you are on any heart or blood pressure medications. Enjoy the blossoms, but from afar!
