

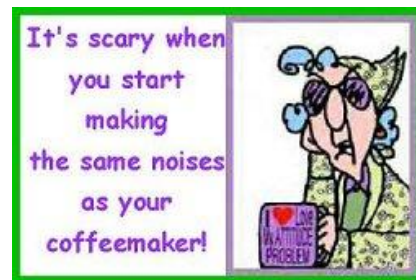

A huge hit was an impromptu hot dog barbecue outside on our deck. Mel Spicer donned an apron and cooked the hot dogs which were consumed with

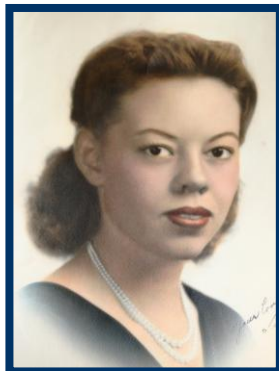




Meet Minnetta Hare

Happy Birthday to Carol Holmer, Jessie Feeney, Frances Flemmg, Bonnie Lindstrom and Sharon Philbrick!



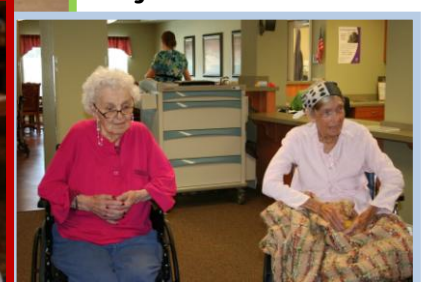
